Our Question of Faith sessions explore a Christianity topic from the locally agreed RE syllabus, with a whole year group over a whole or half day. These longer experiences in schools allow pupils to explore together what "real, live" Christians believe about a particular theme, through a range of fun, dynamic activities including games, stories, quizzes, illusions, drama, puzzles, writing, music, drawing, craft, and so on.

Each session includes a "Question Time", which gives an opportunity for pupils to thoughtfully reflect on the things they have learned, and pose any questions that they still have to a member of the visiting Schools Team.

We are very clear to explain that every child has a right to choose their own faith, and that we have been invited into the school to explain what that means for Christians, rather than to enforce any belief.

We are happy to base our Question of Faith sessions around Units from the Living Difference and Understanding Christianity syllabuses, as well as any other Christian themes or concepts.

Our Question of Faith sessions are best suited to an in-person, team-led visit on site at your school. However, we can also provide Online Learning Packs which contain self-guided resources tailored to a specific Christian topic.
